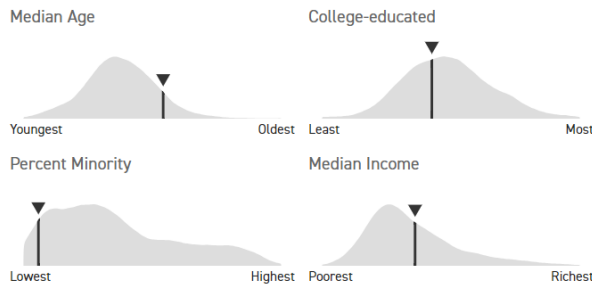

Democrats unearthed a drunken driving conviction in Mr. MacDonald's past that involved an accident that cost a motorcyclist his leg, but the ad had no apparent impact.</p> <p><b>MIRS Analysis</b> (November 6, 2018): First time candidate Michael MacDONALD, a Sterling Heights financial representative for Northwestern Mutual and vice president of the Michigan Air Force Association, turned out to be everything the Republicans had hoped.</p> <p>His relentless door-knocking regimen made Yanez and Democrats sweat out a district they felt was in the bag after Macomb County Commissioner Leon DROLET passed on the district and the R's were left without an experienced candidate.</p> <p>Trump's popularity in this traditional union-heavy Macomb County district made the environment hard for the 18-year firefighter with strong Democratic credentials. The Democrats tried to soften up MacDonald by playing up a 2007 drunk-driving accident that caused a motorcyclist to lose a leg.</p>

**Gongwer Analysis** (November 6, 2018): Republican former Rep. Kevin Daley of Lum is headed to the Senate after winning the 31st Senate District race Tuesday, keeping the seat in his party's hands after upending his Democratic opponent, Bay County Clerk Cynthia Luczak. Mr. Daley took 60.3 percent of the vote to Ms. Luczak's 39.7 percent based on unofficial results with all precincts reporting.

Mr. Daley was able to bring out the vote in the Lapeer and Tuscola county portions of the district to offset turnout in the Democratic strongholds in Bay County. Ms. Luczak despite seeming to be a strong recruit did not gain a lot of traction or monetary support from her party caucus.

**MIRS Analysis** (November 6, 2018): Former Republican Rep. Kevin DALEY, the dairy farmer from Lapeer County, is returning to Lansing after edging Bay County Clerk Cindy LUCZAK in a late-developing campaign.

After winning a spirited, high-dollar GOP primary, Republicans initially disengaged when they struggled to see Luczak's low-energy campaign catching any traction with voters. But Luczak's attraction as a pro-life candidate with the support of popular local Democratic moderates like Bay County Executive Jim BARCIA eventually registered.

By late October, the SRCC had dropped close to \$300,000 into shoring up the Daley, a long-time local official whose win was buoyed by getting almost 70% of the vote out of his home Lapeer County.
