




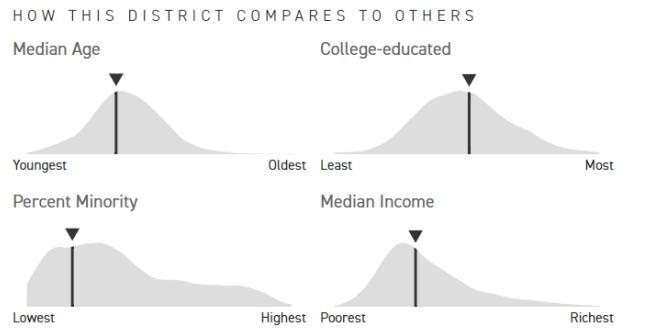

MIRS Analysis (November 6, 2018): In the 3rd District, U.S. Rep. Justin AMASH (R-Cascade Twp.) survived a deteriorating Republican brand in Kent and Calhoun counties to win a fifth term in Congress. The libertarian-leaning Amash managed to genuinely separate himself from Trump and Republican leadership while Democratic opponent Cathy ALBRO struggled with raising funds.

Without the attention of the Democratic Congressional Committee, the Middleville owner of an education-focused childcare center found herself often left to her own devices.

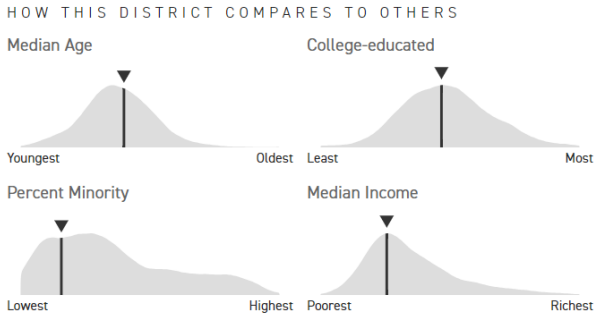

MIRS Analysis (November 6, 2018): In the 6th District, U.S. Rep. Fred UPTON (R-St. Joseph) withstood a spirited challenge from former YMCA Medical Director Matt LONGJOHN, whose use of his medical doctorate degree during the campaign became an issue.

Upton's narrow win over the Democrat was his closest-ever General Election margin. Prior to his election, Democrat Mike O'BRIEN had come to the closest with an 11.98 percent margin in 2012.

Longjohn is not licensed to practice in medicine in Michigan, but used imagery during the campaign that suggested he saw patients as part of his job. His background is on the administrative side (See "Longjohn Heralds Legal Defense For 'MD' Title; Complaint Against Him Filed," 10/5/18).

Upton had flirted with running for the U.S. Senate for much of 2017 before opting to run for re-election. Like Walberg, Upton made opioid reform legislation a centerpiece of his campaign, but unlike Walberg, Upton is a member of the bipartisan Problem Solvers Caucus.

The win means the former U.S. House Energy and Commerce Committee chair will serve a 17th term in Congress, making him the most senior member of the Michigan delegation with the retirement of U.S. Rep.

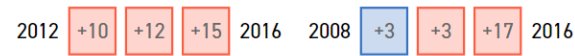

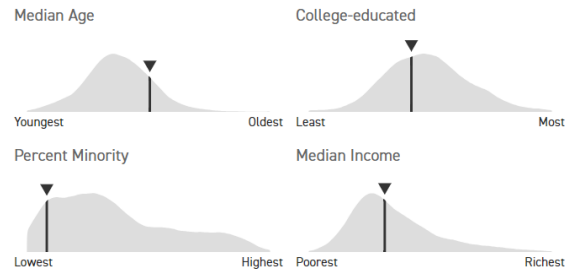

MIRS Analysis (November 6, 2018): In the 7th District, conservative U.S. Rep. Tim WALBERG (R-Tipton) found himself singing from the hymnal of bipartisanship after the primary for in his second straight victory over Gretchen DRISKELL.

Walberg, 67, will serve his sixth term in Congress representing the Eaton County-to-Monroe County district on the back of strong support in the district's Ohio border counties.

Driskell, 59, the former two-term House member and Saline mayor, picked up strong support in Eaton, Jackson and her home Washtenaw County. Her defeat

		<p>was closer than the 15-point margin Walberg beat her by in 2016 when Trump polled strong in the 7th.</p> <p>A variation of this district was last represented by a Democrat in 2009-10, when Mark SCHAUER unseated Walberg for a term during the Obama wave election year.</p>

The power of incumbency, ability to work across the aisle and her involvement in several major legislative initiatives in the current term were not enough in the end to secure a second Senate term.</p> <p>MIRS Analysis (November 6, 2018): After losing by a mere 61 votes in 2014, former Rep. Sean McCANN toppled Sen. Margaret O'BRIEN in one of the state's most competitive elections. With 100 percent of precincts reporting, McCann won 53 to 42 percent. Libertarian Lorence WENKE received 5 percent.</p> <p>The mild-mannered former city commissioner benefited from a district that is trending strong in the Democrats direction.</p> <p>O'Brien, the driving force behind expanding the statute of limitations on sexual assault in the face of the Larry NASSAR scandal at Michigan State University, got some survivors to appear on TV ads for her. Her visibility in passing a three-foot passing halo for bicyclists and quickly delivering bottled water to Parchment Township after their municipal water tested high for PFAS buttressed her support and showed she was a hard-working public servant.</p>

Brandt Iden (R-Oshtemo Township) won re-election with a 1,284-vote margin over Democrat Alberta Griffin of Texas Township in the 61st House District. It is the third time Democrats have spent big trying to defeat Mr. Iden and come up a little short.</p> <p>MIRS Analysis (November 6, 2018): This may well have been the state's most expensive House contest this year. Alberta GRIFFIN was the state's top fundraising Democrat after the primary, pulling in \$163,501. Incumbent Rep. Brandt IDEN (R-Oshtemo Twp.) was the highest raising Republican in the same time period, 79,845. Then caucus PACs put additional money behind these two, Republicans spending \$263,454 on behalf of Iden and Dems putting \$73,720 behind Griffin. That's because this district leans only slightly in favor of the Republicans, an edge that could easily evaporate in the year of the blue wave and the year of the woman. Iden pulled it out 51.3 percent to 48.5 percent.</p>
